Part 3 – Text 1

Avian influenza viruses pose a growing threat, with the potential to adapt to humans and trigger future pandemics, according to a new report by the European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control (ECDC) and the European Food Safety Authority (EFSA). The study identified 34 key mutations in avian influenza viruses that may increase the likelihood of human infection.

Health experts are increasingly concerned as bird flu cases continue to rise among wild birds worldwide, particularly in the US, where an outbreak among poultry and dairy cattle has resulted in 67 confirmed human cases and one death. Between September and December 2024, 657 highly pathogenic H5N1 avian influenza virus detections were reported in domestic and wild birds across 27 countries in Europe. The detection of H5N1 among domestic animals living in farms, such as an outbreak that affected cats in Poland, increases the risk of human infections. H5N1 has also affected dogs in Canada, Italy and Poland, farmed fur animals in Spain and Finland and is especially spread between dairy cattle in the US.

Part 3 – Text 2

Mosquito-borne diseases such as dengue and malaria will become a bigger part of the curriculum at medical schools across Europe in the face of the climate crisis, medical school leaders said, announcing the formation of the European Network on Climate & Health Education. Led by the University of Glasgow, 25 medical schools from countries including the UK, Belgium and France will integrate lessons on climate into their education of more than 10,000 students.

This year was Europe's hottest summer on record and changes in climate are increasing pressures on health services. Insects that spread diseases, such as mosquitoes, are expanding their range and being found in new areas, aided by changes in temperature and rainfall patterns. Chronic diseases such as cancer, heart and lung conditions, diabetes and mental illness can all be affected by factors such as extreme weather or air pollution. "Climate change doesn't necessarily create a whole new range of diseases that we haven't seen before but it exacerbates the ones that do exist," the project leaders said. Antimicrobial resistance, in which pathogens evolve so existing drugs no longer treat them effectively, is also being exacerbated by climate breakdown and this should be reflected in medical teaching.
